

PRESBYTERIAN COFFEE PROJECT



Although a cup of coffee can cost \$1.00 or more, the farmers who grow the coffee receive very little of this money and are caught in the cycle of poverty. The Presbyterian Church has created the Presbyterian Coffee Project to encourage congregations and members to use their purchasing power to improve the lives of farmers around the world by purchasing fair trade coffees.

These coffees are provided by Equal Exchange, an employee-owned company which works with small-scale farmer cooperatives to pay a fair price to the farmers who grow the crop thus giving them assistance to help them to build a better future for themselves and their families. Many of the coffees are also organically and shade grown, protecting the rainforest.

Equal Exchange also works with cooperatives to give fair prices to Cocoa and Tea farmers for organic shade grown cocoa and tea.

The Session has voted to participate in the Presbyterian Coffee Project by purchasing this coffee for use during our fellowship hour and church events. The Mission Committee is also purchasing the coffee for resale at cost to our members. We have the following products available for purchase after church on Sundays.
